

Art Exhibition Registration

Wednesday, January 4, 2023 through Friday, February 10, 2023.

One form must be submitted for each entry.

- There is a separate form for Members, Men's Corner, and Children's Corner entries.
- Entry forms will be available in the office and on the Tuckahoe website beginning on January 4, 2023.
- Forms will also be attached to Art Show articles in the Tuckahoe Flyer beginning on January 8, 2023.

Art Exhibition and Sale Rules

THESE RULES MUST BE STRICTLY FOLLOWED IN ALL CATEGORIES BY ALL EXHIBITORS.

- A maximum of three (3) entries per category is permitted except for a maximum of two (2) entries for Children's Corner and Quilting.
- Works may not have been previously exhibited at The Tuckahoe.
- All entries must have been completed in the last five (5) years with the exception of Needle Arts entries.
- All works must show exhibitor's name and title of work on the back.
- Members and Children's Corner exhibitors have the option to have their work judged. Each registration form should be marked accordingly.
- The judge is granted the privilege of awarding as many ribbons as deemed worthy. Ribbon color (blue, red, or white) is acknowledgement of the level of achievement as determined by the judge.
- One (1) tricolor ribbon will be awarded to the "Best in Show" for each category, as well as for each Needle Arts sub-category.
- One (1) gold ribbon will be awarded for the best "Original Design" in Needle Arts and one for the "Most Creative" in Creative Arts.

IN ADDITION TO THE GUIDELINES LISTED ABOVE, PLEASE ADHERE TO THE INSTRUCTIONS SPECIFIC TO EACH CATEGORY.

Art Sale to Benefit The Scholarship Endowment Fund

Participating artists can elect to sell their art entries with a minimum of twenty-five percent (25%) of each sale contributed to The Scholarship Endowment Fund. This opportunity is extended to all exhibit categories. Only items registered for exhibition may be sold.

A donated art item will be offered for the annual raffle with 100% of the proceeds benefiting The Scholarship Endowment Fund.

Painting Exhibit

- Paintings submitted in this category may include oil, acrylic, watercolor, pastels, mixed medium, silk screen, collage, and sketching.
- Only original source material (i.e., plein air paintings done on site and/or finished from artist's own or other amateur photography) is allowed.
- Paintings must be framed or gallery wrapped (staples do not show on the sides) with sides painted and ready for hanging to include eye hooks or screws attached to frames with wire on the back. Paintings that are incorrectly framed and wired will not be accepted. Clip-on frames are not acceptable.

- Paintings over 3 X 4 feet (including frames) will be accepted on a space available basis and must come with hardware needed to support weight.
- Pairings or groupings of paintings will be counted as individual items and limited to a maximum quantity of three (3).

Photography Exhibit

- Work must be original and photographed by a Tuckahoe Woman's Club member. All methods of photography (digital and film) are acceptable.
- Photographs must be framed in wooden or metal frames or canvas (gallery) wrapped and ready for hanging to include eye hooks or screws attached to frames with wire on the back. Photographs that are incorrectly framed and wired will not be accepted.
- Photographs may be printed on metal, aluminum, or glass but must be made ready for hanging. These do not need to be framed.
- No plastic frames, plastic string brackets, or clip-on frames will be accepted.
- All photographs printed on unmounted photography paper must be matted and framed. If mounted to foam core board, the photograph needs to be matted and framed.
- "Series" photographs must be grouped in one frame and matted. Multiple framed photographs will not be accepted as a "single" entry.
- For the best showing, you are encouraged to enter photographs no smaller than 8 X 10 inches.

Needle Arts Exhibit

- Entries must be done by a Tuckahoe Woman's Club member and may be submitted in the following sub-categories:
 - 1) Embroidery and Needlework to include smocking, crewel, needlepoint, and other canvas work
 - 2) Yarn Arts to include knitting and crochet
 - 3) Quilting
- All work must be completed and blocked for exhibiting.
- Due to space limitations, entries must strictly adhere to a maximum of three (3) items in the first two sub-categories and a maximum of two (2) items in the third sub-category. An entry that has multiple parts, such as a pair of pillowcases, will be counted as one entry.
- If you have any questions regarding classification of work, please contact the Needle Arts Coordinator before submitting your registration form.

Creative Arts Exhibit

- Entries must be done by a Tuckahoe Woman's Club member and may include fine quality, handmade items such as sculpture, ceramics, Christmas decorations, dolls, hand-painted articles, jewelry, miniatures, porcelain, pottery, weaving, woodworking, scrapbooking, "trash to treasure" items, etc.
- All entries must be original, i.e., no copies of any original works, patterns, prints or reproductions, such as prints of paintings or photographs.
- Entries must strictly adhere to a maximum of three (3) items with the exception of any entry that is clearly a "set," such as a set of stemware.
- If you have questions, please contact the Creative Arts Coordinator before submitting your registration form.

Men's Corner Exhibit

- Husbands of members are invited to exhibit original paintings, photography, carvings, handcrafts, jewelry, needlework, "trash to treasure" items, woodcrafts, etc.
- Entries will not be judged; only paintings and photography may receive a written critique by the judge if requested on the entry form.
- If you have questions, please contact the Men's Corner Coordinator before submitting your registration form.

Children's Corner Exhibit

- Members' children and grandchildren, ages 5 through 18, are invited to exhibit original paintings, photography, carvings, handcrafts, jewelry, needlework, "trash to treasure" items, woodcrafts, etc.
- Paintings and photographs must be framed and ready for hanging.
- Entries will be judged but not critiqued.
